*Incarvillea delvayi* 20 for \$4.00  
To 35 cms. Masses of large, pure white trumpet shaped flowers from late spring. Cut back after flowering so this will rebloom. Bold, divided leaves. Sun. Moist, well-drained soil. Nice for pots.

*Lathyrus latifolius* 'White Pearl' 30 for \$4.00  
Large white flowers in summer. Climber. Sun.

*Ratibida pinnata* 30 for \$4.00  
1.2 metres. (Yellow Coneflower). Showy yellow flowers with droopy soft yellow rays. Cone-like green centres. Attracts insects. Drought tolerant. Excellent cut flower. Sun or part shade.

*Sisyrinchium californicum* 30 for \$4.00  
(Yellow-Eyed Grass). To 20 cms. Star-shaped, dark-veined, bright yellow flowers in summer. Long flowering. Clump forming. Sun. Suit coastal areas. Tolerates a little shade. Becomes drought tolerant

*Verbascum chaixii* 'Album' 30 for \$4.00  
To 1 metre. Erect spikes bear dense white flowers studded with purple and orange 'eyes' Sun or light shade. Cut spent spike and new ones will be produced. Rich green leaves form a nice rosette.

Low growing. Grey foliage. Pinkish/lavender flowers on short stems. Sun and good drainage. Alpine.
- Coreopsis 'Sunkiss'* Few D \$10.00  
To 35 cms. Large, golden yellow flowers with burgundy red centres in summer. Sun.

To 40 cms. Bushy rhizomatous perennial with numerous branched stems. Bears yellow daisy like flowerheads in loose corymbs in early summer. Sun or part shade, well-drained soil. Large.

They and the unripe fruit, produce an aromatic, volatile oil which may be ignited in hot weather. Specimen plant best planted where you can brush past it so the beautiful fragrance is released. Suits a perennial border. Grow in dry, well drained, moderately fertile soil in full sun.
- Dictamnus albus var. purpureus* D \$10.00  
(Burning Bush). Year 2 plants. May take 2 years to flower. Mature plants are 80 to 90 cms. Highly fragrant, purply - mauve, 5-petalled flowers with darker veins and long, projecting stamens are borne in long, open racemes in early summer. Specimen plant in garden and best planted where you can brush past them so you can enjoy the fragrance released.

Phyteuma scheuchzeri D \$10.00  
Low mound of narrow blue-green leaves. Taller stems hold spiky ball-shaped clusters of deep blue flowers in summer. Rich moist soil and good drainage. Excellent rock garden or edging plant.

Potentilla megalantha Double Red Few D \$12.00  
To 50 cms. Lovely double red flowers spring to summer, long flowering. Light shade intensifies flower colour. Sun/part shade, good drainage. Prune early spring to promote new growth.

Potentilla verna \$10.00  
15 cms. Small light yellow, cup-shaped flowers in spring. Sun. Suits rockery or edge of border.

Pulsatilla vulgaris 'Rose Bells' D \$12.00  
To 25 cms. Clump forming perennial with finely divided light green leaves. Rose pink flowers. Spring flowering – often a light second flowering in autumn. Sun. Suits rockery or alpine garden

Salvias are long flowering, showy, highly fragrant plants for sunny borders.  
Good drainage. Attract bees.

Salvia 'Blue Hills' \$12.00  
To about 45 cms. Lovely blue flowers in summer. Cut back after flowering and look forward to an autumn flowering. Sun and good drainage. Rockery, edging, slope or bank. Attracts butterflies.

Salvia Bright Red \$9.00  
Unnamed but a very good bright red variety that is well worth a spot in your sunny garden.

Salvia Castanea Few D \$10.00  
To 60 cms. The flowers grow in whorls on an inflorescence about 30 cms long. 'Castanea' which means 'chestnut coloured', refers to the purplish-maroon flowers. Fragrant foliage. Sun. Large pots.

Salvia 'Glare' \$12.00  
To 70 cms. Masses of bright white flowers. Long flowering. Compact habit. Good drainage. Sun.

Salvia x jamensis 'Raspberry Royale' \$10.00  
To 80 cms Purplish-red flowers with dark red, velvety lobes. Highly fragrant – attracts bees/butterflies. Spring to autumn flowering. Sun/light shade. Good drainage.

Salvia x jamensis 'Riverton Red' \$10.00  
To 70 cms. Purple red flowers from late spring to autumn. Highly fragrant, attracts bees. Sun and good drainage.

Salvia x jamensis 'Salmon Queen' \$12.00  
To 60 cms. Fragrant leaves and showy flowers that are a very good salmon colour. Flowers late spring onwards. Long flowering. Sun and good drainage. Attracts bees and butterflies. Popular.

To 80. Drooping arching stems of slender bottlebrush like flowers in summer, that are a lovely rosy red colour. Sun. Clump forming habit. Very popular.
- Saxifraga crustata* \$10.00  
Alpine. To 24 cms when in flower. Dense mat of grey green rosettes with silvery edging. Panicles of small starry flowers with long yellowish-white petals. Rockery. Sun or light shade.
- Scabiosa caucasica* 'Blue Mountain' \$12.00  
To 60 cms. Masses of large blue flowers on tall stalks. Remove old flowers to prolong flowering spring to autumn. Sun, good drainage.
- Scabiosa caucasica* 'Fama' \$10.00  
To about 80 cms. Large white flowers on long stems. Suitable for picking. Sun or light shade.
- Scabiosa caucasica* x 'Fama' – Blue \$10.00  
To 90 cms. Large frilly mid blue to purple/violet flowers. Sun or light shade.

To 50 cms. Large white flowers which are suitable for cutting. Sun or light shade.
